**Cecile Licad**'s fame rose to a legendary status when the 20-year-old pianist won the gold medal in the Leventritt Competition. Since then, she has performed in every major venue around the world and in partnership with some of the most outstanding musicians. Her program will feature Beethoven's "Moonlight Sonata," Ravel's *Gaspard de la nuit* and Liszt's monumental B minor Sonata. The concert will be introduced by renowned radio broadcaster, author and lecturer, David Dubal.

**"Let's Dance!"**

Vienna-based organist **Darko Pleli** will bring to us a unique program of dance music from the Middle Ages to the music of David Bowie. The concert will also showcase works from the Robertsbridge Codex, Kerll, Sweelinck, Soler (*Fandango!*), Gigi D'Agostino and others.

**"Chopin: The 2 Piano Concertos"**



Following last year's successful experiment in presenting Chopin's F minor Concerto in a new version for piano and string quintet, **Sandro Russo**, SCC's own Music Director, will return for a performance of both piano concertos, written by the world's most beloved romantic composer.

**MAY 20, 2018 - 5:00 p.m.**

The newly-formed **Polaris Piano Trio** is dedicated to performing innovative programs that highlight works by female composers and composers of African descent from the 19<sup>th</sup> century through the present. The Mendelssohnian work of Louise Farrenc and the Negro Spirituals of Samuel Coleridge-Taylor are among the composers the Trio will present.
