The use of Church grounds for burial is an old and honored tradition, especially among the Protestant churches of colonial New England. It developed out of the desire to be buried in sacred ground, to remain close to one's spiritual community, and for a quiet place of remembrance and contemplation.

The Washburn Garden is a columbarium... a repository for cremated remains. Members and friends of the Church may participate in the Washburn Garden in a variety of ways.

Reservations may be made for burial in an urn placed into a niche .... the hollowed-out space within the stone benches identified by a bronze plaque mounted on the granite slab. (below)

 Deceased members and friends may be memorialized with a bronze plaque. (at right by door)

Reservations may be made for burial in a biodegradable bag placed on Church grounds. Sites are unmarked and the deceased is memorialized by a bronze plaque on a granite slab affixed to the wall of the Church. (*right*)
